



## **FAQ OBEDIENCE TRAINING**

### **BASIC OBEDIENCE**

For dogs 4 months and older

Must have full set of DHPP+C, Bordetella and Rabies vaccinations

Must be free of external and internal parasites, and flea protection

#### **Program:**

5 sessions, 1 hour each

Basic on-leash commands: Heel, sit, sit-stay, down, down-stay, come

Problem solving for common issues including:

Hyperactivity, separation anxiety, bad manners around the house, potty training, dog language, pulling on leash, dog and people shyness, behavior training around children

### **INTERMEDIATE OBEDIENCE**

(After completion of Basic Obedience)

#### **Program:**

Advanced off-leash commands: Heel, sit, sit-stay, down, down-stay, come

Some agility exercises

## BASIC TRAINING CLASSES FAQ

### *Teaching your Puppy to Mind their Manners*

1. How do I sign my pet up for Puppy Kinder or Basic Obedience classes? We accept sign-ups whenever Otay Pet Vets is open. You can call and reserve your spot; don't delay, as we only allow 10 dogs and their people, per class.
2. How much does the training cost? Classes cost \$115.00
3. Where are the classes located? The classes are held at Otay Pet Vets, in the Otay Ranch Town Center, in Chula Vista.
4. How long are the classes and what time do the classes start? The classes are 5 weeks in duration, every Friday at 6 pm
5. How many dogs are in the class? We limit the class size to 10 pets to allow more individual training.
6. Can my whole family come? Yes, we encourage the whole family to be involved in the training.
7. What are the recommended ages to begin puppy obedience training? We prefer puppies to be 12 weeks or older, with current vaccines (DA2PPC, Bordetella, Rabies). For Basic Obedience pets should be 4 months and older; and we recommend neuter and spay for better results.
8. Who is the trainer? Our trainer is Susan Cardenas. Susan is highly recommended by Otay Pet Vets. She has been training dogs and helping families with pet behavior modification programs, puppy kindergarten, and basic, intermediate and advanced obedience for many years.
9. What if I miss a class? We recommend that you do not miss any classes, but in the event you do, we allow you to make up the class, if available.
10. What do I need to bring? We recommend that you bring a collar and leash that fits your pet's neck properly. We highly recommend purchasing a gentle leader, available at Otay Pet Vets for \$24.99 and some soft treats that your pet likes.
11. What will I be required to do after the classes? Susan recommends that you practice all the steps that you have learned in the class daily, and have a lot of fun in the process.
